Office of Disability Services (ODS)

ODS assists students who may need academic accommodations. Students may submit a request form through the ODS website along with supporting documentation to begin the process.

Important Dates:

- Deadline to submit accommodation request for Fall: June 1
- Deadline to submit accommodation request for Spring: December 1
- Deadline to submit accommodation request for Summer: 6 weeks before start of term

Veterans may submit documentation they currently have from the VA Hospital, along with any disability benefit statements to start the process. Parking & Transportation

We are committed to making sure your transportation and parking needs are addressed. You will find various veteran-specific transportation resources offered through our department and in coordination with Miami-Dade County Transit.

All students interested in obtaining a parking permit can begin the application process by clicking <u>here</u>. Next, select the green bar titled "Access your parking account to purchase your permit", located centrally on the page. Proceed by choosing the "UM login" button and enter your UM credentials. Afterward, chose "Get Permits" and follow the subsequent instructions to reach the permit application, where you can select from available color zones.

Veteran-Specific Plates

Any UM student with a Disabled Veteran or Purple Heart Combat Wounded Veteran license plate will be granted a University parking permit at no cost. The permit will be granted for a parking zone based on current availability and will be held to all regular parking restrictions. The permit can be purchased at the Office of Parking and Transportation, where plate and vehicle registration will be verified prior to approval of permit.
